Consul's Address

This semester the brothers of Beta Rho have continued striving for excellence in academics as well as in the community. The chapter boasted a 3.13 GPA in the spring semester, which ranked second amongst the fraternities and well above the All Undergraduate average. The chapter has recorded over 300 hours of community service serving Montana State University and organizations in the community this semester, such as Eagle Mount. The brothers also cleaned up a stretch of highway that was adopted in memory of Brother Karston Waarvik, who joined the Chapter Eternal in the fall of 2012. Brother Waarvik has been dearly missed for his sense of humor and overall drive to bring Sigma Chi to new heights. In memory of him, his mother Karen Waarvik, has set up a scholarship fund to continue reminding the Beta Rho chapter of their commitment to striving for excellence and cultivating men of good character. Furthermore, Beta Rho had the great honor of having one of its own members elected as Homecoming King this past October. The chapter is headed in a positive direction and is pleased to welcome 23 new members into the brotherhood.

Beta Rho has faced some hardships over the past semester, and has truly banded together as a brotherhood to bring positive change to the chapter. The brothers have debated over reforms in our risk management policy and we have successfully implemented a new revamped plan for the future. We also held a strategic planning session in late September to discuss the direction of the chapter and what areas needed improving. This was conducted under the guidance of Brother Steve Nash, an alumnus of the Beta Delta chapter, who helped us brainstorm attainable goals for the year. Some of our goals involve maintaining an active chapter GPA of 3.0 or higher, attain 800 hours of community service, and raising at least \$4,000 for the Huntsman Cancer Institute. These discussions have caused the brotherhood to undertake challenges that the vast majority of undergraduates would never face at this point in their lives. Throughout the duration of the dialogues, the chapter kept the state of mind that we will gain the strength to overcome these obstacles. Regardless of the troubles the brotherhood will face, we have discovered we will always be able to band together for the practice of friendship, justice, and learning.

The brothers continue to stay involved on campus through clubs and organizations. We volunteer with United Blood Services by collecting donors and helping on collection days. Also, three of our brothers were selected as leaders for the MSU Orientation Program and will assist with helping the new students register for classes and transition into college life. Brothers continue to be involved with various other organizations on campus like the Voice Center, Engineers without Borders, National Society of Collegiate Scholars, the Office of Admissions, and Bobcat Club. In total, the Beta Rho chapter has at least one brother involved with over 40 clubs and organizations on campus.

I could not be more proud of the chapter and its willingness to soar to new heights. The leadership amongst our young members is truly evident through their enthusiasm to take new positions and wanting to prove to the community that Sigma Chi expects more of its members

than the world expects of other men. These men will lead the house in a great direction as I go into my last semester as Consul and they continue to carry on new traditions like our Waarvik Fest, which is a concert event held in honor of Brother Waarvik. I am excited for this coming semester and the chapter plans to hold a large campus wide event in the near future, so the results will be posted in the next newsletter. Under the supervision of our new Chapter Advisor, Ryan Donahue, Beta Rho continues to do very well at MSU and in the Bozeman community and continues to prove the worth of its members.
