## BETA RHO HOUSE RENOVATION UPDATE

We announced in the spring edition of *Bobcat Sig* that we decided to delay the start of our renovation on the dorm side of the house (Phase 1) by a year. We have now determined that contractors in the Gallatin Valley are maxed out because of the booming property development taking place in the area. Consequently, we will be forced to delay the start of Phase 1 until the summer of 2023.

In the meantime, planning will continue. We have finished preliminary discussions with the Sigma Chi Foundation regarding the amount of educational space the renovated premises will have. Our architects have drafted detailed plans that will enable us to have discussions with mechanical and electrical engineers and, most importantly, general contractors. Each dorm floor will be identical in design with four double rooms, three single rooms, and one double-room-sized group study. Each brother occupying a room will have a built-in bed and desk.

At this point, the plan is to begin demolishing the dorm-side interior in May 2023 and have it rebuilt for the opening of classes in mid-August. The renovation to the rest of the house and the exterior (Phase 2) will take place in the summer of either 2024 or 2025.

The total cost of these renovations is largely an educated guess at this point. We know that costs of material and labor have increased dramatically over the past two years, especially in the Gallatin Valley. We have approximately \$1.2 million of donations that have been collected and are at our disposal. Once we have obtained cost estimates from general contractors, we will know more precisely where we stand financially.

Induction into the Order of Constantine is the highest honor that Sigma Chi bestows upon one of its members for years of outstanding and faithful service to the fraternity. **Paul Boylan '64** received this award based in part on the endorsement by several Beta Rho alumni. Presented below is the endorsement letter from **Brother Bill Gum '63**, which takes a comprehensive look at Paul's impact on Beta Rho over the span of nearly eight decades.

"It is a great pleasure to submit this letter of recommendation. I have enjoyed a unique, 76-year relationship with Paul Boylan and truly believe he is worthy of the distinction of the Order of Constantine. From playgrounds to conference rooms, he has been a friend, mentor, role model, advisor, and on many occasions, a co-worker.

As a college freshman, I was educated by Paul on the attributes of becoming a Sigma Chi. I became an inspired pledge whose proudest moment was being initiated into Beta Rho under Paul's leadership as consul. A much deeper meaning was instilled into our friendship.

Paul's task as consul was not easy with 62 active chapter brothers living in the house and another 78 actives and pledges living in apartments and dorms. But his leadership was fair, clear, and consistent.

I do not recall a moment of dissent or major disagreement. On campus, the chapter reigned supreme in athletics, academics, student leadership, social, and community involvement.

Several years after departing into the real world, Paul returned to Bozeman full-time and became a magnet for attracting brothers back to Homecoming. With his planning, direction and hard work, the house gatherings have become an annual ritual to this day. It is a time for reflection on the past and a demonstration to young brothers of the benefits and true meaning of a lifelong bond.

The active chapter was quick to recognize Paul as a credible and trustworthy mentor. They established a permanent slot for him at executive meetings to garner his advice. His knowledge of maintaining and preserving the house was so respected and appreciated by both the chapter and alumni, he was overwhelmingly elected to his still current position of House Building Corporation President. Acknowledging Paul's integrity for improving the lifestyle for all Greek undergraduates at MSU, the dean of students solicited his help to review and recommend changes to the MSU Greek Housing Regulations. His inquisitive nature for improving living conditions led to discussions regarding Greek organizations purchasing land from the University to build new, contemporary-style homes. The President of MSU has since formed a committee of Greek alumni and school administrators to provide recommendations for accommodating the future growth of the Greek community. Most recent, Paul has been tasked with the responsibility for being certain Beta Rho's living environment meets all COVID health and safety standards and that the active chapter is attentive and responding to all requirements.

While Paul demonstrates a never-ending dedication to hands-on maintenance and face-to-face leadership, he still attends the monthly Beta Rho Alumni Luncheons—sometimes referred to as The Old Guys Lunch. The core of this enthusiastic group of brothers is 75 to 82 years old. When the stories of the old days conclude for the day, the focus usually shifts to Paul for a welcome response to the question, 'What's happening at the house?'

In Bozeman, if a question or concern regarding Sigma Chi is raised by a student, parent, alumnus, administrator, local business, or community leader, the response will be—Better Call Paul.

In short, Paul has committed his life to making a difference. He has made a difference for Sigma Chi, Beta Rho, Montana—and his beloved Bozeman. I highly recommend Paul Boylan for the honor of being admitted to the Order of Constantine."
